Being Committed to the Word of God: Look Up!

Fix these words of mine in your hearts and minds; tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. —Deut. 11:18

National Public Radio once featured a story about a man in New York who goal was to visit 1,000 New York City bars. They reported he completed his goal at the cost of \$10,000.00 and many, many hours and late nights. The man reportedly said that it had given meaning and purpose to his life. What gives meaning and purpose to your life today? What or who gives you direction?

In the Bible, there are many references and stories about looking to the stars for direction and meaning. Many found it. They discovered meaning and direction about God's plan for the world and their lies by looking toward heaven; toward God. The night sky reminds us of the vastness of God's heaven and earth. We are reminded of how faithfully the mighty acts of God through history have formed our identity and purpose as God's people. The multitude of stars that Abraham saw, that we see, each night, remind us of God's promise of abundance in faithfulness. So, make the commitment. Be more grounded in God's Word. When you make this your goal and act on it, be prepared to find yourself on fire for Christ. Resolve through prayer to read and study the scriptures every day. Ask God to communicate new meaning and purpose for your life and for this church.

Following the Word of God is following Christ. Being committed to Christ is this church's hope for an unimaginable but God promised best future. Remember to pray for one another. Look for signs along the way. Look up. Look to the heavens, to the starry night sky. Remember the promises found there with the Lord. Remember, we are all in this together, thanks be to God.


Sunday Morning Flowers Given for the Month of April

You Better Tell Somebody! by Byron Wade - (PCUSA "Next Church" article)

Growing up in South Central Los Angeles, my mother would take me and my two brothers to get haircuts occasionally. We always went to Scottie's Barbershop, which was owned by Scottie and his brother who was also a barber. Both of them were Jehovah's Witnesses and from the time you got in the chair until the time you left, all Scottie would do is talk non-stop about Jehovah while cutting your hair. Scottie never proselytized to me but always spoke about how good and awesome Jehovah is and what a difference he made in his own life. Plus, he seemed so happy doing it! I never came close to leaving the Presbyterian Church but his witness was so strong that I still remember it after all these years.

As Presbyterians, we are known for a lot of things and evangelism is not one of them. Let's face it – calling ourselves the "frozen chosen" is not a sure-fire way to get people interested in coming to our churches, much less developing a relationship with Jesus Christ. However, I believe that we have a God who is the Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer of the entire world and through the Holy Spirit we can tell others of what God has done, is doing, and will do in our lives. So how do we go about sharing the story of Christ? Drawing on my personal and communal experiences, I will share a few tidbits:

It starts with YOU – My homiletics professor in seminary always told us if you don't have passion and excitement about what you are preaching, chances are the congregation will not either. It is the same way with evangelism – you have to have and convey excitement and joy in witnessing to other about Jesus Christ. We may begin by asking ourselves, "what do I believe about Jesus?", "what is my relationship with Christ?" and "how can I tell others what God has done for me?"

...but not by yourself – Rev. Clinton Marsh, in his book, Evangelism Is..., says "Evangelism is the work of the entire people of God." Our faith is not formed alone in a vacuum; it is formed by belonging, listening, and learning with others through the Holy Spirit in the community of faith as well. Evangelism is done differently in various ways. Some churches have evangelism committees; others commission individual church leaders for that responsibility. At Davie Street, we believe everyone has a story to share about their faith with others. Specifically, we engage the congregation during our Tuesday midday prayer studies and monthly family night dinners. In both events, members and invited guests discuss current events/issues such as justice, racism, immigration, gun violence, and others in light of what scripture says (or doesn't say). In most cases participants have a better understanding of the issue and what "says the Lord" so when they go out into the world and encounter others, they can converse and share their faith through stories and examples.

This is just one method, but whatever you do, make sure volunteers undergo some evangelism training to help them be able to share their faith in a way that is inviting and non-threatening.

Cast a wide net – In many places, communities and ways are life have changed. We are living in an increasingly diverse world, not to mention one that is moving at a faster and faster pace. This could cause challenges to evangelism as we come in contact with people, cultures and lifestyles to which we are unaccustomed. However the time is ripe to spread the Gospel of Christ. Evangelism today will move us into sharing faith with people who have a different faith or no faith, various races, ethnicities and sexual orientations, and those who have limited time and interest. But your story – and THE story – is still the same.

In the African-American religious and social tradition, we have a saying, "You better tell somebody!" My hope is you will have the faith and confidence to tell somebody the story of who Jesus is, what he has done for you, and how others can find this living water. Amen.



The Volunteers of the Food Pantry are very proud and thankful for the new side by side refrigerator/freezer donated to the Pantry by David and Sally Erskine. What a blessing!

Publix delivered a pallet of food to the Pantry in April, another blessing. Thank you Lord. The pallet contained several cases each of: breakfast bars, Pet evaporated milk, fruit, instant potatoes, rice, mac & cheese, tuna, 2 lb. cans of ham, Dinty Moore Stew, soups, green beans, and peanut butter and jelly. I estimate a value of the donated food was

between \$800 & \$1,000. That's a whole months budget.

The children will be out of school soon. Those who qualify for meals at school will be eating all their meals at home now. We see an influx of families with school aged children requesting food from May until September. Jobs are more plentiful during these months but this increase of mouths to feed puts a burden on the families. Please remember the Pantry during this time.

Summer means warmer weather. Our hygiene items are very low. We need deodorant, shampoo, lotion, bars of soap, female hygiene items, and shaving cream for the guys.

We thank the Erskine's, Publix, and our congregation for their generosity. May the Lord bless all of you and make us each ever mindful of the needy.
